Belize has for years been quietly earning a reputation as one of the world's best travel destinations for birding. With an amazingly diverse landscape supporting some 603 identified species ranging to seabirds like the Magnificent Frigate Birds and Ospreys, to Harpy Eagles and Orange Breasted Falcons in Mountain Pine Ridge, rainforests filled with Parrots, Toucans and Mot Mots, and a colourful assortment of Hummingbirds everywhere, being a birder in Belize is like being a kid in a candy land.

In the 1990s when The Lodge at Chaa Creek agreed to host the Birds Without Borders - Aves Sin Fronteras project sponsored by the Foundation for Wildlife Conservation and the Zoological Society of Milwaukee, the project resulted in the recording of over 300 endemic and migratory birds in the Chaa Creek area, and led to the training of local naturalist guides, some of who became passionate about specialising in birds.

And now all of that knowledge and passion has come together with Chaa Creek's Avian Adventures.



Belize Rainforest Raptor Discovery

Travel within a five-mile radius that's home to Blackhawk Eagles, Bat Falcons, Grey Hawks, Roadside Hawks, Crested Caracara and other Belizean raptors while your guide explains their behaviours and importance to the health of this rainforest ecosystem.

This tour takes in Cayo District wetlands and riverine areas as well as San Ignacio Town, with an opportunity to enjoy lunch at the Guava Limb Café.


